Professor Dr. Andréa Diniz, Coordinator of the Postgraduation Program in Pharmaceutical Sciences, Concentration Area: Biologically Active Natural and Synthetic Products, at the State University of Maringá, in the exercise of her duties, hereby ANNOUNCES the opening of applications for the selection process for the second semester of 2026 for the MASTER'S DEGREE program.

The Postgraduation Program in Pharmaceutical Sciences will allocate three (3) vacancies for affirmative action policy quotas and three (3) vacancies for persons with disabilities (PCD).

2. DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR APPLICATION

Copy of the undergraduate diploma (front and back), or equivalent document, or a document certifying that the applicant is able to complete the undergraduate program before beginning graduate studies. - 2.5. Undergraduate academic transcript.
- 2.6. Lattes Curriculum for the last five (5) years, documented and organized according to the sequence of entries in the Lattes Curriculum.
- 2.7. Certificate of passing the English Language Proficiency Examination, with a minimum required score of 6.0 – C, in accordance with Resolution No. 099/23-PCF, available on the PCF website. <http://siteadmin2.uem.br/pcf/resolucao-proficiencia.pdf>
- 2.8. **Legible copies of the following documents:**
 - a) Identity Card (RG) and Individual Taxpayer Registration (CPF), or the National Identity Card (CIN);
 - b) Birth or Marriage Certificate;

Time and place for submission of applications:

From 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., at the Office of the Graduate Program in Pharmaceutical Sciences (Av. Colombo, 5790 – Block K68, 2nd Floor, Room 215, Main Campus, Maringá, PR – ZIP Code 87020-900).

Applications sent by mail must ensure that the documents reach the Office by the final date established in the application schedule.

3. SELECTION PROCESS

Applicants will be evaluated in two stages:

3.1. Interview

Interview with the PCF Selection Committee, preferably with the advisor in attendance. If necessary, ask for remote interview (only for foreigners).

3.2. Curriculum Analyse

Standard Lattes curriculum vitae, documented, covering the last five (5) years.

4. RESULTS

The publication of results is the responsibility of the Coordination of the Graduate Program in Pharmaceutical Sciences, through a Notice to be posted at the Office and published on the PCF webpage.

5. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- The application fee shall not be refunded.
- No documents relating to the stages of the selection process shall be issued.

- The selection process shall remain valid until the next selection process.
- The submission of additional documents after the application period shall not be permitted.

- Appeals against the published final result must be filed within five (5) business days with the General Protocol Office of the State University of Maringá, addressed to the PCF Selection Committee.
- The final selection result shall be approved by the Academic Council of the Graduate Program in Pharmaceutical Sciences.
- The documents of applicants who are not approved may be collected from the Office until July 20, 2026. After this period, the documentation shall be incinerated.
- Cases not covered by this Public Notice shall be resolved by the Coordination of the Graduate Program.
